Acceptable Use Policy (AUP) for Artificial Intelligence

*The Following Acceptable Use Policy Applies to
all SCIMUN participants:*

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to outline the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools such as ChatGPT throughout the duration of the SCIMUN conference. These rules are in place to ensure a fair and engaging debate environment for all participants.

Acceptable Use

AI should only be used for preliminary research purposes. This applies to asking general prompts when brainstorming ideas for speeches or resolutions. Even so, it is important to note that AI technology may produce factual inaccuracies. Whether to trust the authenticity of information generated by AI is at the delegates' own discretion.

Prohibited Use

Delegates **may not** use AI technology to directly draft speeches, resolutions, and answers to Points of Information (POI). All written work must be in their own words. Delegates should rely on their own critical thinking and writing skills.

Enforcement

All delegates are expected to comply with this policy. Our runners will monitor AI usage during committee sessions and report any form of inappropriate use to committee chairs. Upon the first violation, delegates will receive a warning written in note form. Repeated violations will result in the confiscation of digital devices for the remainder of the conference.

During approval panel, all resolutions will be required to go through AI checks. Resolutions high in AI writing will be recognized as plagiarism and will not be approved for debate.

Reporting Violations

We encourage delegates to hold each other accountable and report any misuse of AI technology. To report a violation of this policy, delegates may send a note to the chairs or contact Cabinet members directly.
